FLOOD INSURANCE DISCOUNT!!!!

You may have noticed that flood insurance rates have increased. Also some homes that may have not been in the Flood Plain previously are now within its boundaries. Properties within the flood plain should have flood insurance. The City takes part in the National Flood Insurance Program's (NFIP) Community Ratings System (CRS). The floodplain management activities implemented by our Town has qualified our residents to receive a 10% discount on their flood insurance. FEMA will automatically reduce all Delaware City residents' flood insurance by 10%, you do not have to take any action.

Other ways to decrease your rates is to first, talk to your insurance agent. Second, get an elevation certificate which may change your base flood elevation which is what your insurance rate is based on. This is costly to get, but could save you money in the long run. Thirdly, you can also retrofit your foundation or add flood vents. Some modest remodeling can reduce your rate. For more information on flood insurance visit www.floodsmart.gov.
