
## SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL

The Delaware Department of Transportation (DelDOT) invites the public to attend a public workshop to review and comment on proposed pedestrian improvements to the block bounded by Clinton, Washington, Harbor, and Front Streets. This Transportation Alternatives project will include new brick sidewalk and stone curb through the project limits and upgrades to the curb ramps, lighting, and pedestrian circulation. This workshop will also provide an update on the project's timeline.

The Public Workshop will be held on November 16, 2015 at the Paul H. Morrill, JR. Community Center at 5:30p.m. Interested persons are invited to express their views in writing, giving reasons for, or in opposition to, the proposed project. 

- Junk Mail/Envelopes (all types)
- Paper
- Paperboard (cereal/tissue boxes)
- Corrugated Cardboard (flattened)
- Narrow-Neck plastic bottles (examples: milk jugs, bleach/detergent, shampoo bottles)
- Plastic Grocery Bags
- Glass Bottles/Jars (any color)
- Metal Cans (tin, steel and aluminum)
