Significant Events

- On February 27th, The Delaware City Police Department investigated an alleged burglary complaint at a residence in the 300 block of Washington Street. This complaint was unfounded.
- On February 16th, the Delaware City Police Department responded to a fight in progress at a residence in the 200 block of Hamilton Street. Two juvenile females were charged with offensive touching and warrants for offensive touching have been obtained for a third juvenile.
- On February 19th, The Delaware City Police Department investigated an allegation of patient abuse at the Governor Bacon Health Facility on Ft. DuPont. The investigation revealed the victim had made a false report.
- On February 21st, the Delaware City Police Department investigated a criminal mischief of two transit buses at the Delaware Surplus on the grounds of Ft. DuPont. As a result of an agreement between the parents of the children responsible for the damage and the management of Delaware Surplus, the kids were not charged with a criminal offense but agreed to clean up the mess they made on the bus as a result of discharging fire extinguishers inside the buses.
- The National Drug Take Back will be held on Saturday, April 28, 2018, between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. Anyone wishing to get rid of any of their prescription drugs can drop them off at the Delaware City Police Department.
