### Announcements

- Delaware City Fireworks will be held on Sunday, October 7, 2018. It is anticipated the fireworks will begin at 7:00 p.m. and end around 7:45 p.m.
- Parking restrictions for Delaware City Fireworks will go into effect beginning at 5:00 p.m. Sunday evening. The following parking restrictions will take effect:
  - Beginning at 5:00 p.m., there will be no parking on Clinton Street from Second Street to the circle at Battery Park. Violators will be towed!
  - Beginning at 5:00 p.m. Washington Street at Front Street will be closed to vehicular traffic (except emergency vehicles) until one hour after the fireworks have ended.
- Shuttle Service for Delaware City Fireworks is as follows:

- Parking for the Disabled will be in the parking lot adjacent to the Delaware City Fire Company. A shuttle for disabled individuals will begin at 4:00 p.m. and end one hour after the fireworks have ended.
- We would also like to remind residents that pets are not permitted on Clinton Street between Second Street and Battery Park beginning at 5:00 p.m.
- The St. Georges Bridge will be closing to all vehicular traffic beginning on Monday, September 10, 2018. According to Deldot and the Army Corp of Engineers, it is anticipated the bridge will be closed for six months. Due to the bridge closure, Delaware City is likely to see an increase in vehicular traffic on SR 9 (Fifth Street).
- The Delaware City Police Department is pleased to announce that we have solved the case of Stumpy's missing housing unit that was stolen from in front of Pampered Pets. The theft occurred in the evening of July 21<sup>st</sup>. DCPD was able to obtain a subpoena of bank records which identified the one of the suspects involved in the theft. Through interviews we were able to identify all parties involved. Stumpy's housing unit was returned to its location and all of the parties involved have apologized to Mrs. Titus for the theft.
